What about a robot?

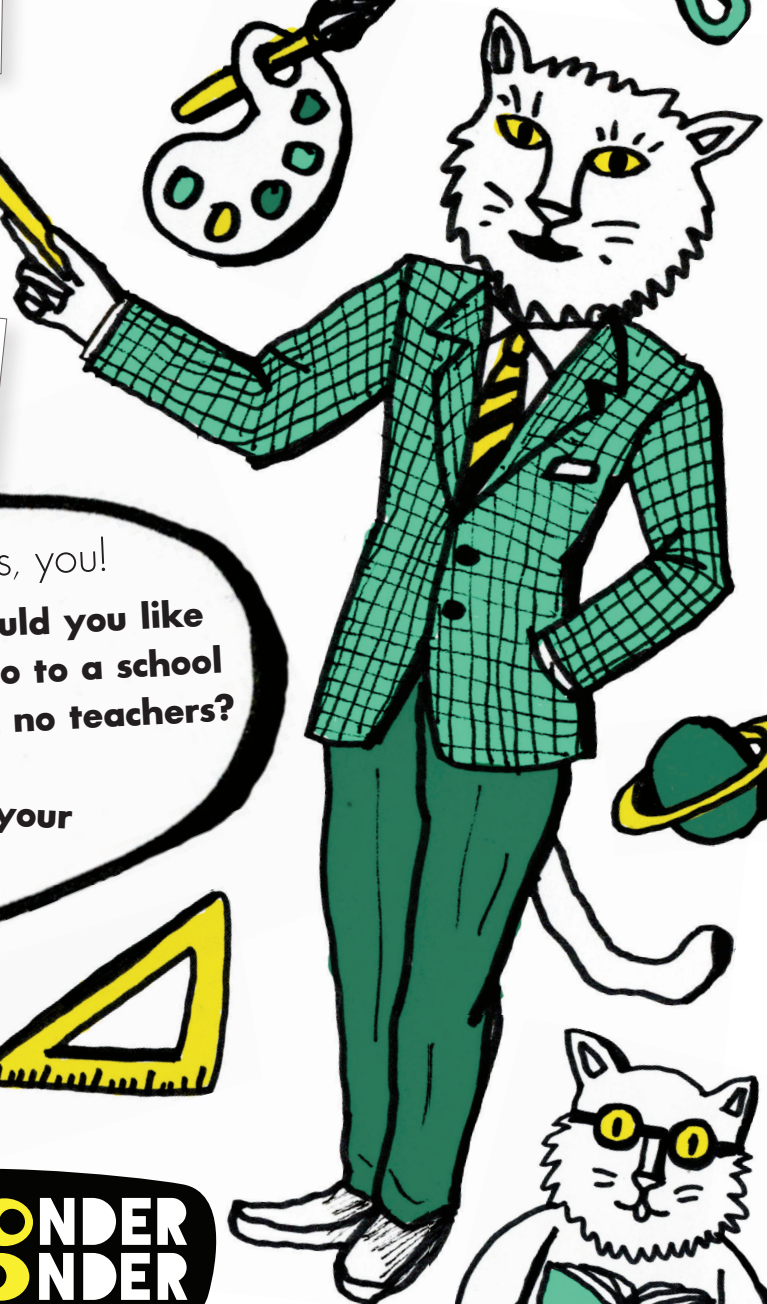
Have you learned anything so far today?

What is the difference between educating and taming?

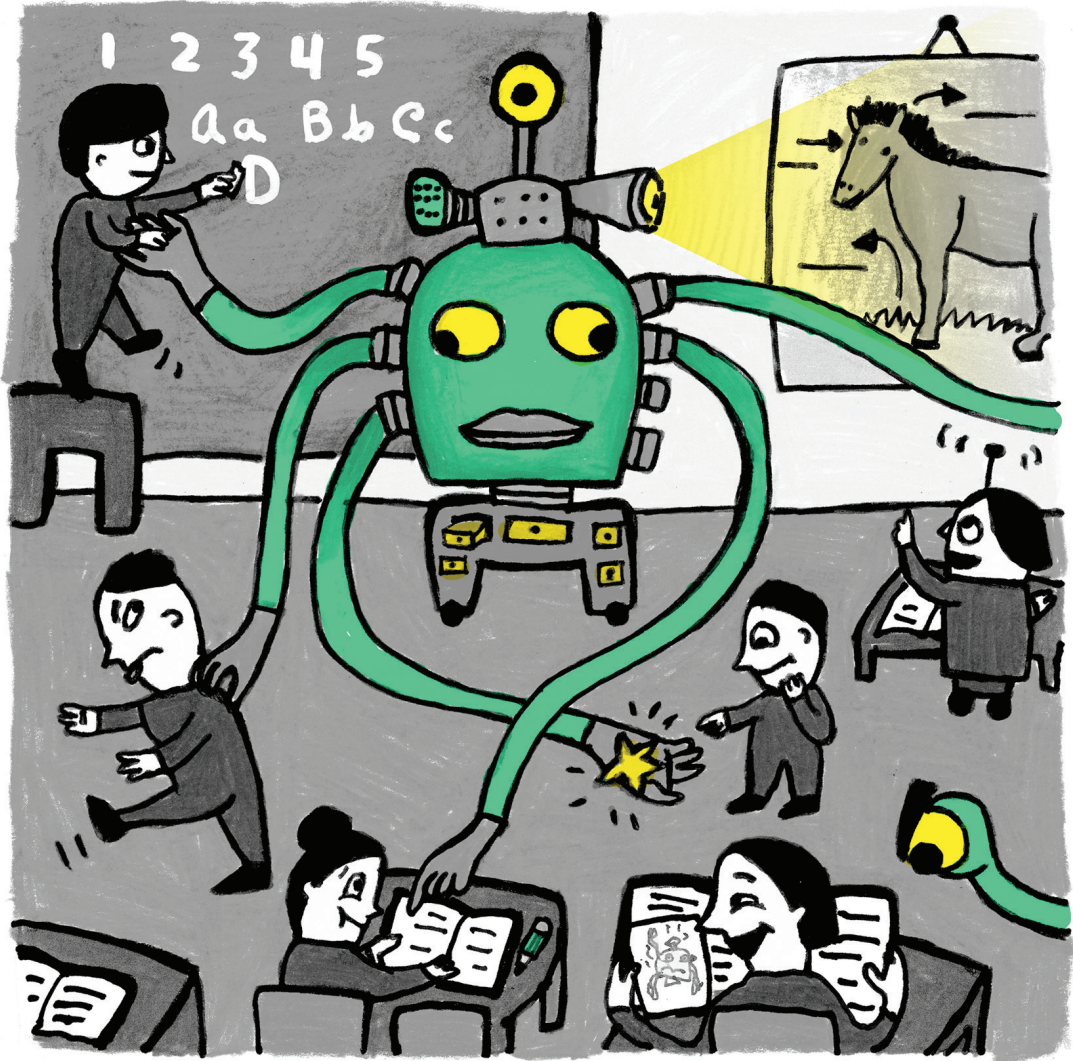
What is the difference between playing, learning and working?

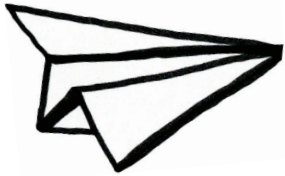

What would you do if a classmate asked you to do something you did not want to do?

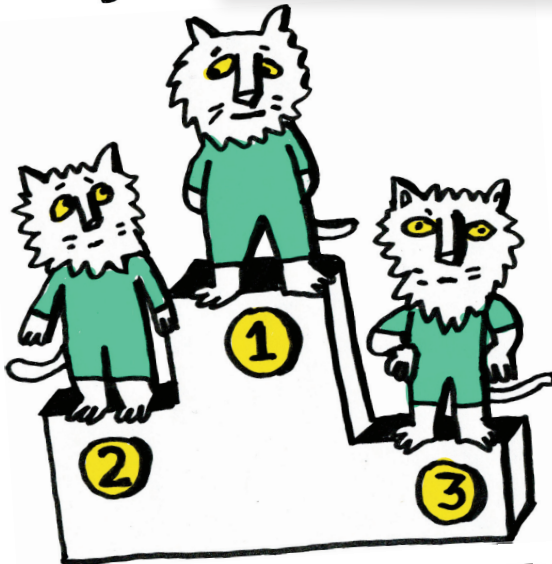


Is there anything you would never ever forgive even your best friend for?
